ABOUT THIS WORKSHOP...

The goal of this workshop is to develop the abilities of C.P.P. candidates to become supply chain leaders and supply chain management professionals, i.e. to lead groups of people and to manage change. This workshop is supported by selected chapters of James G. Clawson's *Level Three Leadership*, 3rd edition, along with a number of articles profiling Supply Chain Management (SCM) leaders.

In addition, candidates develop leader profiles based on their own experience which must be completed during the evening of Day 1 and presented to the class on the morning of Day 2. This workshop will also include a presentation and discussion on the certification of supply chain management professionals and the shift from purchasing to strategic supply chain management.

YOU WILL LEARN TO:

- Understand the shift from purchasing to strategic supply chain management.
- State and discuss the characteristics of a supply chain professional.
- Compare various other points of view (follower's, bureaucrat's, administrator's and contrarian's) with the leadership point of view.
- Apply the three elements of the leadership point of view to a situation (problem or opportunity) at their organization.
- Start creating a "leader profile" of a supply chain leader at their organization.
